In <u>Saturday Into Sunday</u> McDaris documents her spring 2004 return to her hometown of Memphis, Tennessee and journey through select towns in the state of Mississippi. The exhibit is a unique, atmospheric and personal reflection on the area's social undercurrent. McDaris's photographs portray both local luminaries and anonymous citizens who are integral to her reacquaintance with the region. The work illuminates a uniquely stimulating and combustive, if not festive, environment wherein the local sheriff is as likely to be recognized and revered as the celebrity rapper.

McDaris credits much of her photographic and artistic viewpoint to her unconventional and formative experiences growing up in Memphis. While the South has long interested photographers and writers for its diverse cultural grist, McDaris's photographs are a personal tribute to the region that has informed her aesthetic approach and experience.

McDaris is 25 and currently resides in New York City. She has participated in a number of group and solo shows, including <u>Recent Work</u>, CMC Gallery, Santa Fe, New Mexico, 2002 and <u>My Vacation</u>, Modern Culture Gallery at The Gershwin Hotel, 2002. McDaris attended Pratt Institute from 1997-2001. She has curated a number of exhibits and is co-creator of <u>Catholic</u>, a series of art catalogues.
